Bagaimanapun, menerusi catatan yang dikongsikan Steven dalam laman sosial Facebook (FB) miliknya memaklumkan gadis itu terpaksa menolak tawaran berkenaan atas faktor kedaifan

keluarga.

"Seharusnya ini (tawaran belajar) berita baik sebab memang impian Dharsini selama ini ialah untuk menjadi seorang *software engineer* (jurutera perisian) namun oleh sebab keadaan keluarga yang daif, Dharsini mengambil keputusan untuk tidak mene-

rima tawaran tersebut.

"Ibunya seorang OKU penglihatan. Sudah jatuh ditimpah tangga. Beberapa tahun lalu, ibunya kena *accident* (kemalangan) menyebabkan kaki pula patah manakala ayahnya sudah tiada.

"Dharsini tak sanggup membebankan ibu tersayang. Yuran universiti

campur segala se-

muak kos men-

cecah pu-

luhan ribu," katanya.

Ahli Parlimen Bukit Mertajam itu berkata, beliau sebak dan terharu apabila gadis itu memberitahu menerima tawaran kerja separuh masa di sebuah pasar mini dengan pendapatan sekitar RM1,500 sebulan sekiranya rajin bekerja.

"Dia beritahu duit itu boleh jaga ibu dan sedikit sedikit dia akan menabung untuk pergi belajar jika keadaan lebih baik nanti.

"Saya berasa terharu bercampur kagum kerana pada usia muda ketika ramai sedang mengejar cita-cita, Dharsini sanggup melupakan cita-cita sendiri demi ibu tersayang.

"Kat (dekat) poli (politeknik) dulu dia memang pelajar yang baik dan dapat CGPA 3.4. Dia kata dia nak kerja bidang AI (teknologi kecerdasan buatan) sebab

itu pekerjaan masa depan, tapi apakan daya," katanya.

Katanya, beliau yang mendapat laporan kisah hidup gadis itu membuat kejutan buat dua beranak terbabit.

"Saya bawa borang UTeM minta Dharsini isikan. Dia terkejut, dia kata duit nak daftar, lebih RM2,000 pun dia tak mampu nak bayar jangan kata kos-kos lain nak pergi sambung belajar.

"Kalau Uncle Steven dah mai (pergi) bagi borang, semestinya Uncle Steven akan pastikan semua itu tak jadi masalah. Saya bagi tau Dharsini dan ibunya, kos nak belajar kat UTeM saya tanggung semua termasuk yuran pendaftaran serta komputer riba.

"Kalau dapat PTPTN, dana yang saya bagi itu boleh guna untuk tumpang keperluan hidup termasuk keperluan ibunya," katanya yang turut menjadikan gadis itu sebagai anak angkat.
